CASE #1:

In the first period, with Team A in control of the ball in A's backcourt, the official stops the game to permit players to search for a contact lens.

PROCEDURE:

The stoppage of play to search for a contact lens shall be treated the same as a play stoppage to attend to an injured player. If it is for a Team A player, the shot clock and back court counts shall remain as they were when the game was stopped. No reset of the shot clock and no new back court count. If it is for a Team B player, the shot clock shall be reset to 24 and Team A shall get a new 8 second back court count. ARTICLES: 5.2; 28.1.3; and 50.3.

CASE # 2:

After the ball is handed to A-3 for a throw-in, B-5 fouls A-5. PROCEDURE:

A personal foul shall be assessed to B-5. A throw-in shall be awarded to Team A unless Team B has 5 or more team fouls in which case A-5 shall be awarded 2 free throws. If this foul occurs during the final 2 minutes of the 4th period or the final 2 minutes of any extra period, then an unsportsmanlike foul shall be assessed to B-5. A-5 shall be awarded 2 free throws plus Team A shall be awarded a throw-in at the center line extended opposite the scorer's table. ARTICLE: 17.2.4.

CASE #3:

During the first period, B-1 commits an unsportsmanlike foul on A-2 who had a clear path to the basket. Within the final 2 minutes of the 4th period, B-1 holds A-3 while the ball is still in the hands of the thrower-in A-1. B-1 is assessed his/her 2nd unsportsmanlike foul. PROCEDURE:

The official shall instruct the scorer that when an unsportsmanlike (contact) foul is assessed, he/she shall indicate a "U" foul on the score sheet. As is the case with a player who has committed 5 personal fouls, when any player commits 2 unsportsmanlike (contact) fouls, that player is considered disqualified (not ejected), and therefore must leave the game, but shall be permitted to sit on his/her Team bench. ARTICLES: 36.2.3 and 36.2.4.
